

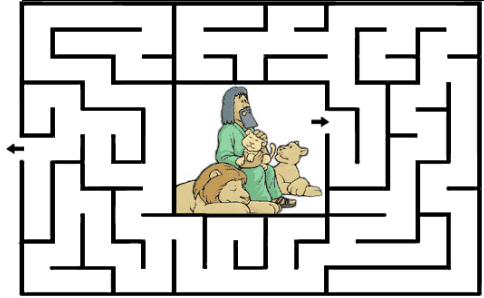

PRAYERS Surely this is one of the main reasons many people come to church is to pray? Most of us have found it helpful to pray with eyes closed and head bowed. Some people prefer to pray with hands held open, or even arms raised as a sign of being open to receive from God and there are also people ready to pray with you after the service if you request it.

OFFERING (We prefer this word instead of "collection"). Church Members are encouraged to give a thought out or prepared sum of money to the work of this church on a weekly basis. Many of us even give a tithe - which is 10% of all that we receive to Christian work. However, there is never any embarrassment to pass the bag on without putting anything into it and if you attend another church regularly or come this morning as a guest, then you need to feel free not to give to this church.

Prime Minister for a day

As we look at Romans chapter 13 you will be asked what would you do if you were Prime Minister for a day. Here is what a couple of you would do:

If I was Prime Minister for a day I would have people change or "swap" jobs with others to make people more understanding to the pressures of others. For example, private sector workers should work as teachers or within the government for a day, whilst well remunerated public sector workers should work in low paid and demanding private sector positions and vice versa. This would encourage people to appreciate the roles that others do in our society. *Jason Hill*
